UPDATES FROM WORKING GROUPS HEALTH PROMOTION

Hepatitis Victoria

HepVic has developed a new resource
 'Be Free from C' which discusses
 hepatitis C treatment options for people who are transitioning out of prison or have recently been released.

It includes a health passport that facilitates access to previous health tests that will inform treatment on release.

Harm Reduction Victoria (HRVic)

• HRVic have been working with Graham Brown from **ARCSHS W3 Project** to create new evaluation tools for our peer and workforce BBV education.

• A new site has been added to the Peer Network Program, and they are recruiting new volunteers for the site in Geelong. There are now 11 new volunteers licensed to give out injecting equipment and model safer injecting practices.

• HRVic are also working on hepatitis C resources in languages other than English and hepatitis C testing and treatment projects involving peers. This is with the support of the EC project.

UPDATES FROM WORKING GROUPS TRAINING & EDUCATION DAT

Fibroscan Training & Loaning

 Fibroscan technician training delivered in partnership with Dept.
 Gastroenterology, St Vincent's Hospital Melbourne have provided training to 8 registered nurses specialising in Hep C.

• Loaning an EC Fibroscans: EC partnership are providing a short-term Fibroscan loaning services to regions that have difficulty accessing machines. Services can request use of the Fibroscan by emailing Mellissa Bryant mellissa.bryant@burnet.edu.au

o **Two portable Fibroscans are available for short-term loaning -** areas that have limited access will be prioritised

o **Rotations so far include:** Goulburn Valley Health, Ballarat Community Health, Bendigo Community Health, Barwon Health, Tasmania Health Service

o At the Tasmania Health Service, trained staff utilised the machine to perform over 100 scans in a 12-week period!

DATA SYSTEMS & SURVEILLANCE



• The ACCESS team have developed an updated HCV Site Reports which will be used to provide feedback to participating EC and ACCESS sites on hepatitis C testing and treatment uptake at their clinic.

• GRHANITE data extraction software has been installed at cohealth Braybrook, meaning all three EC pilot sites are now contributing data to the ACCESS surveillance system.

 The EC team led a validation process using clinical data provided by a participating EC sites and we found:
 Previous antibody tests not recorded

in patient management software as they were performed elsewhere or before the software was available

- Scripts not generated within the medical practice software cannot be picked up via GRHANITE, this includes any paper or hand written scripts

- A large number of patients with hepatitis C listed as a condition - do not have a "current" or "active" diagnosis

• Also for prisoners is the "Art Inside -Liver Health Notebook", the recently completed round of combined education and art sessions resulted in the art work created by the prisoners used as a way of reinforcing the main themes of testing, treatment and cure.

HARM REDUCTION VICTORIA

• To mark World Hepatitis Day HRVic will be attending events at Sacred Heart Mission, LAUNCH Housing, and Hepatitis Victoria. We will also be distributing lollipops, pill boxes and lip balm branded with nationally coordinated hep C messages.



• Rapid EC Study was conducted at3 community clinics with NSPs -Healthworks, Innerspace, North Richmond Community Health, to assess the feasibility and acceptability of point of care (POC) testing for HCV.

 NSP workers, community health workers (CHWs), and nurses offered POC tests to clients accessing the NSP. Clients were offered OraQuick HCV antibody test using saliva (20 mins) and Cepheid's Xpert HCV viral load using serum (105 mins).



Key Results:

 174 participants completed POC testing for HCV antibodies - 150 (86%) had a reactive result

• 140 (93%) underwent a POC HCV RNA test, of who 76 (54%) had detectable **RNA**

• 104 of the 140 (74%) attended the follow-up visit within a median of 11 days (IQR 7-20 days).

 Clients reported strong preferences for POC tests (97/116, 85%)





















 Burnet and St Vincents Hospital Melbourne coordinated the 'Sustaining Elimination' National Hepatitis C Workshop, 28th March, Melbourne Airport

• Aims: Ensuring Australia has a sustained response to Hepatitis C prevention, testing and treatment to achieve hepatitis C Elimination by 2026.

• **Objectives:** Identify pathways to scale up awareness of treatment in affected communities, identify activities to sustain high levels of harm reduction/prevention and identify key activities coming out of workshop.

• Over 65 delegates from all states and jurisdictions attended this workshop. The feedback was very positive, such that it is envisaged this will become an annual workshop moving forward.

MELBOURNE'S MEDICALLY SUPERVISED INJECTING ROOM

The medically supervised injecting room (MSIR) is now open!

The MSIR is a safe and hygienic place where people can inject drugs in a supervised health setting. This means that if someone overdoses in the room, a staff member can respond immediately. It's also a place to access other health services like mental health support, drug treatment, wound care and blood testing.

How does it work? Step 1: registration and a brief assessment Step 2: medically supervised injecting and overdose response Stage 3: aftercare and referral

MSIR has opened as a two-year trial.

Reorientation of the Integrated Hepatitis C Service (IHCS)

The Australian Research Centre in Sex. Health and Society in partnership with the Department of Health and Human Services, is leading the reorientation of the IHCS to develop a contemporary nurse-led model of care to increase community-based testing and treatment.

Viral hepatitis implementation working group

DHHS has established implementation working groups for HIV, sexually transmissible infections and viral hepatitis. The Victorian viral hepatitis implementation working group was convened in June 2018.

The purpose of the implementation

group is to: provide expert advice on implementation of key actions identified in the strategies; identify gaps in implementation of key actions; and provide advice on monitoring and reporting of the strategies against the relevant indicator framework.

The implementation group is **developing** an implementation tracker and will produce an annual report summarising progress against priorities identified in the hepatitis B and C strategies.

VHHITAL

The Victorian Department of Health & Human Services have provided funding for a state wide BBV/STI Education & Events Calendar. This calendar relies on individuals entering their own events so that all sector stakeholders can see what Is happening around Victoria. Anyone can submit an event.
